CRAF

(Common Risk Assessment Framework)

The Family Violence Risk Assessment and Risk Management Framework (CRAF) is a key aspect of the Victorian integrated family violence reforms. The tool is designed to assist professionals and practitioners, working with women, to identify risk factors associated with family violence and to respond appropriately.

The framework is now being used by family violence services as well as a wide range of agencies and service sectors including housing and homelessness, Maternal Child and Health Nurses, court registrars, police officers, Child Protection and disability workers.

The Victorian Government is providing a third program of fully funded training sessions to all regions across the state from August to November 2010. A partnership of Swinburne University, Domestic Violence Resource Centre Victoria and No To Violence developed and deliver the training sessions.

Case Notes, Domestic Violence & the Law

Sometimes workers are unclear about the purpose of case notes - in their day to day practice and in the role they play in the legal process. This two-day training is presented by DVRCV & Women's Legal Service Victoria (WLSV) and aims to inform participants about the requirements of taking and keeping case file notes and their legal implications. The topics covered in the session will include: models for taking case notes; writing style and context to cover legal issues; responding to a subpoena; being a witness; and writing reports for court. The training will provide participants with opportunities to ask questions and apply their knowledge.
