Identifying family violence and risk assessment

(Formerly: Recognising and responding to family violence)

This introductory course is for workers with no specific family violence work experience. It covers the effects of family violence on adults and children, and provides an overview of legal responses, resources and referrals. The program explores asking about violence and responding to disclosures, and includes a component on risk assessment and safety planning based on the Common Risk Assessment Framework (CRAF).

CHCDFV001 - Recognising and Responding appropriately to Family Violence

Formerly: Introduction to domestic violence



This four-day accredited course provides the basic skills, knowledge and understanding to work effectively with women and their children affected by family violence. It is suitable for new workers in family violence services and workers in community, health or legal services who have limited experience responding to family violence. On successful completion of assessment tasks, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for national units:

CHCDFV001 - Recognise and respond appropriately to domestic and family violence.

Infants & toddlers: using hope to address relational trauma

In this dynamic workshop you will be introduced to the principles of 'infant-led' practice, be provided with accessible and up to date information on brain development and strategies about what should guide you on how to intervene with infants and their families in the context of family violence. This training is relevant for those working as family support workers, in refuge, through to clinicians and case managers. For any professional working with infants, toddlers and young children who have been exposed to family violence and/or early childhood relational trauma, this training is a must. Working with fathers who perpetrate interpersonal violence - This workshop will explore: working with fathers who are perpetrators, naming and detailing the hopes of men, partners and fathers; moving beyond good intentions to daily practices of respect; considering responsible fathering interventions that appreciate connections between fathers' relationships with their children and men's behaviour towards their children's mothers; exploring moving from father centred parenting to child-centred parenting; developing plans with the man for ethical and responsible actions.
